

## Call for Art!

**Shenandoah University** and **Lord Fairfax Community College** invite submissions for a show of juried student art representing artistic talent at both institutions.

### The Artist:

- Anyone who is currently enrolled as a student at either Shenandoah University or Lord Fairfax Community College is eligible to submit work.
- Artists submitting work do not have to be currently enrolled in art classes.

### The Work:

- Work submitted should be interpretive observations from life that are visually compelling, aesthetically pleasing and reflect the personal character of the artist.
- Two dimensional work may include drawings, paintings, mixed media collage, monotype prints, relief prints and photography. Drawings, photographs and prints should be matted. Paintings should be framed.
- Three dimensional work may include sculpture in any medium, ceramics, textiles, glass, and jewelry. It is important that three dimensional work is such that it can be displayed safely and securely.
- Work may be something done in response to an assignment or work inspired by an assignment or it may be the independent expression of the artist.
- A limit of two pieces of work may be submitted by each artist.

### The Dates:

- Work must be submitted for review on April 18, 2006. Shenandoah University students should bring work to Ruebush Hall, Room 114. Lord Fairfax Community College students should bring work to the art rooms at each campus.
- The jurying of the work will take place on April 20, 2006.
- The dates of the show are April 25 - May 11, 2006. An opening will be held on April 25 from 7 to 9 p.m.
- All work must be picked up from the Atrium Gallery at LFCC after 4 p.m. on May 11, 2006.

### The Place:

- All work will be displayed in the Atrium Gallery of the Middletown Campus of Lord Fairfax Community College. This space is open to the public seven days a week.  
Hours: Monday through Friday: 9 a.m. to 7 p.m.  
Saturday and Sunday: 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

### The Jurors:

- Looking at the submissions from Lord Fairfax Community College will be Scott Jost from Bridgewater University and Geraldine Kiefer from Shenandoah University.
- Looking at work from Shenandoah University will be Ann Currie, Chris Stephens, Barbara Sherwood and Robin Teas.

**All art that is submitted** must have a paper attached to the work that includes the following information:

- Name of artist
- Title of the work
- Medium
- Price (we will also use this amount for the value of the work) or "NFS". If work is not for sale, please include a value for insurance purposes.
- Address of artist
- Email of artist
- Telephone of artist
