LFCC to Open Art Exhibit that Features Landscapes of Artists Bruce and Geraldine Kiefer

MIDDLETOWN, Va. – “Twixt Two: Landscapes by Bruce and Geraldine Kiefer” will be on display at Lord Fairfax

Community College (LFCC) from Friday, Dec. 16, 2005, through Friday, Jan. 27, 2006. The pieces will be showcased in the Atrium Gallery on the Middletown Campus, located at 173 Skirmisher Lane in Middletown. The exhibit is free and open to the public from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., Monday through Friday; 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday and noon to 5 p.m. on Sunday.

This is the Kiefers’ second joint show. Their first was held last month at the Shenandoah Arts Council in Winchester. The exhibit features the work of Mr. Kiefer, a fine art photographer, and Dr. Kiefer, an assistant professor of art history at Shenandoah University where she teaches American art, modern art, history of photography and art appreciation.

Complete with color and digital photography, the exhibit features landscapes from a June 2005 stay in rural Bath County, Va., where the Kiefers participated in the Nimrod Hall Summer Arts Program for Artists. The landscape photos were taken by Mr. Kiefer in the early morning hours when dew, mist and fog give depth to the images. These images became the canvas for Dr. Kiefer, who then used



colored pencils to complement and heighten the palettes of the photographs, bringing out their intricacy and mystery. The completed work stimulates the viewer to look between the real and the imaginary.

Founded in 1970, Lord Fairfax Community College is a comprehensive, nonresidential, two-year public institution of higher education with campuses in Middletown and Fauquier and outreach sites throughout the College region.
