



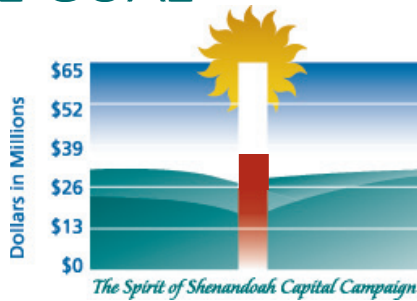

SPIRIT OF VOLUNTEERISM

Dr. Maureen Quinn and Dr. Travis Sample, co-chairs of the Faculty Campaign Council, kicked off an appeal to faculty members in mid-January to participate in the \$65 million Spirit of Shenandoah Comprehensive Campaign.

“Friends of the university have already given \$35.2 million to the campaign,” said Maureen. “This is the time for faculty members to step forward and fuel the momentum, demonstrating to donors that our hearts are vested in the vision of Shenandoah and its students.”



Travis said his goal as council co-chair is “to encourage fellow faculty to ‘catch the spirit’ and become a part of a campaign that will have a dramatic and positive impact on students.

“It’s a unique opportunity to shape the future of our students and one’s own legacy,” he added.
